I. Students will be expected to read college level materials which may include a textbook, supplemental reading assignments, and professional journals in the areas of Child Development as they relate to the course.

E. Appropriate Assignments that Demonstrate Critical Thinking:

Critical thinking assignments are required and may include, but are not limited to, the following:

I. Critical thinking will be required of students in such assignments and activities as written and oral analysis and evaluation of readings, lectures, comments, ideas and observations.
