4. Identify skills required to prioritize assignments/things to be done in an employment situation.

SECTION II

1. COURSE OUTLINE AND SCOPE:

A. Outline Of Topics:

The following topics are included in the framework of the course but are not intended as limits on content. The order of presentation and relative emphasis will vary with each instructor.

- I. Orientation to Work Experience Program.
- II. Review of Work Experience Manual.
- III. Development of job-related behavioral learning objectives.
- IV. Preparation of required program forms/paperwork.

- V. Resolution of job-related problems.
- VI. Conferences with instructor-coordinator and supervisor.

B. Reading Assignments:

Reading assignments are required and may include but, are not limited to, the following:

- I. Readings will include Work Experience Manual and related assignments required by concurrent vocational course(s) and/or employment experience.

C. Appropriate Assignments that Demonstrate Critical Thinking:

Critical thinking assignments are required and may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- I. Students will apply critical thinking skills in the development of job-related behavioral learning objectives and resolution of job-related problems.

D. Appropriate Outside Assignments:

Outside assignments may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- I. See "B" and "C" above.

E. Writing Assignments:

Writing assignments are required and may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- I. Students will write three behavioral job-related learning objectives that are attainable during the semester, and complete all required Work Experience forms/paperwork. Students may also complete written assignments required in their employment experience.

2. METHODS OF EVALUATION:

A student's grade will be based on multiple measures of performance unless the course requires no grade. Multiple measures may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- I. Evaluation (i.e., letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F) will be assigned to all Work Experience students based upon their performance and achievement of the measurable, job-related behavioral learning objectives, attendance at required on-campus Work Experience classes, accuracy in completing required forms/paperwork, promptness in compliance with due dates in submission of forms/paperwork, and attendance at required conferences with instructor-coordinator and supervisor.

3. METHODS OF INSTRUCTION:

Methods of instruction may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- * On-campus orientation sessions, conferences with instructor-coordinator and supervisor, on-the-job training, written assignments, questioning, lecture/discussion, and reports.
